by the Rev. Basaboi (a  
former Missionary in  
Basutoland) - very good.
6. The Zulus by the Rev  
Lewis Gould (American  
Missionary)
7. Zululand by the Rev  
Gardiner (American Missionary)
8. Maclear's compendium  
of Native Laws &c (Cape)

I might enumerate others  
but the foregoing are the  
most useful & valuable.  
They could be ordered  
through your Stationers &  
the official books could  
no doubt be seen in  
the Department of Secretary  
for the Colonies or the  
Colonial Agents General.
