Mr. Peka Isaka Seme, the son of a Zulu chieftain, has just won the George William Curtis medal for honours in oratory at Columbia University. The subject of his address was "The Regeneration of Africa." Mr. Seme had three competitors, but the decision of the judges was given unanimously in his favour. Mr. Seme has received many congratulations. After graduating at Columbia University next June, as Bachelor of Arts, he will begin a course in law at Oxford, hoping ultimately to become a legal representative of his people. He is a loyal British subject, and has high hopes of the development of Zululand under British rule. Although a full-blooded Zulu, Mr. Seme is not a typical member of that race in appearance.
